Filing for Unemployment Benefits for Part-Time Faculty

According to the court ruling known as the <u>Cervisi Decision</u> (1989), if part-time faculty has no reasonable assurance of employment because their status is considered temporary and contingent upon funding, enrollment, and program needs, then you can file for unemployment. Remember, that as a part-time, contingent, community college instructor, you have no guaranteed contract and there is no reasonable assurance of re-employment for the upcoming semester. A class may be taken away for a number of reasons that are not in your control, which makes you eligible for unemployment as soon as the semester ends.
